Always festive occasions, fairs evolved into social events combining commerce and lively competition. As time passed education and technology became important as well. County fairs are a part of Americana; a part of our tradition and our culture. Our El Dorado County Fair embodies all these qualities.

Fair competitions are fun and educational. Kids and adults bring their animals, plants, produce, and preserved foods, as well as various other home arts, like fiber arts, quilting, woodworking, and photography, to show them off and to compete.

This year's El Dorado County Fair will be held June 13-16. UCCE Master Gardeners of El Dorado County invite you to participate in this year's horticulture competitions. Do you have a favorite houseplant that friends compliment and admire? Enter it in the fair! Do you have some early blooming cutting flowers? Enter a few stems in the fair! Maybe you have some early season produce from your garden, such as garlic, onions, herbs, strawberries, plums, or apricots. Enter them in the fair! Maybe have a friendly inter-family competition between parents and kids and see who brings home a ribbon!

On the same page, click on the Exhibits (Non-Livestock) Sections and Forms tab, then on Flowers and Plants, or Fruits and Veggies, to see descriptions and rules for the many categories under each. Entry forms can be found further down the list on the same tab. Forms are due June 11, 2019 and entries must be delivered on June 12, 2019.

UCCE Master Food Preservers also invite you to enter your home preserved foods in the fair competitions. Items canned or dehydrated after last year's fair are eligible, including jams and jellies, pickles, condiments, and cordials.

Many kids attended and enjoyed our Junior Jams and Jellies events this year, and all of them will have an entry for the fair. How much fun it would be for them if their parents also entered something in this category—another inter-family competition! Make it a family tradition! Most preserved food categories have a \$25 prize for 1st place.

For information on this competition, navigate again to the fair website (given above,), click again on the Exhibits (Non-Livestock) Sections and Forms tab, then on Food Items for a list of all the different categories of competition. The junior and adult entry forms are also under this tab. Forms must be submitted by May 23, 2019, but products are not due to be delivered until June 5, 2019. Judging Day, June 8, 2019, is open to the public and is always fun to watch, and educational as well!

Attending and competing in our fair is an American tradition. Family fun, family traditions, and family memories - and bragging rights! Wheelbarrows of fun!
